Anglo-Scottish League

This 'competition', initially called the Anglo-Scottish Midweek Cup, was formed 9 August 1956 after six clubs - Heart of Midlothian, Hibernian, Partick Thistle, Newcastle United, Tottenham Hotspur and Manchester City - met in Edinburgh. The original intention was that four Scottish clubs (the aforementioned plus another, Celtic and Rangers were not interested) would play four English ones (again the ones stated plus Arsenal, who later withdrew). A week later the Scottish League 'asked its clubs to reconsider taking part' and that 'that they may be expelled from the League if they proceed with plans for an Anglo-Scottish floodlight competition'. The English League were also against the competition. Sir George Graham, secretary of the Scottish Football Association was elected as secretary of the new competition and a further meeting was arranged for 27 August in Glasgow to arrange the fixtures. Preston North End were approached to replace Manchester City, but they declined the invitation. Harry Swan of Hibernian was elected President with a Spurs director being VP, but it had no secretary. The word 'floodlight' was later dropped, and the clubs would meet home-and-away between September and December. However the withholding of official sanction by the SFA and English League, meant all the matches had to be played as friendlies. Interestingly, tables continued to be published in official programmes.
